Dear Parent/Guardian,

We are excited to announce that the Fairfield Community Health Center has partnered with Lancaster City Schools to offer onsite immunizations clinics for students in Kindergarten, 7<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grades. The immunizations offered at these clinics are those necessary or recommended for school attendance. There are several immunizations available. For 7<sup>th</sup> grade: Tdap, Men ACYW. For 12<sup>th</sup> grade: Men ACWY and Men B. For Kindergarten: Dtap & Polio combination and MMR & Chickenpox combination. We plan to administer the vaccines on 3 different days in the evening after school and will be sending more information on dates and times. If you would like to participate, we ask that you complete all the steps listed below by Friday October 9, 2020.

**In order to register your child, you will need to complete all of the following listed below and submit the completed paperwork to your child's school by Friday October 9, 2020.**

**Copy of front and back of insurance card/cards**

**Completed and Signed Registration/Consent Form**

**Risk Assessment Form**
