We are excited to announce the Fairfield Community Health Center has partnered with Lancaster City Schools to offer an onsite immunization clinic for our students. The Spring Mobile Immunization Clinic will be Monday, May 17, 2021, at Lancaster High School from 4:30 P.M. through 8:00 P.M. The immunizations offered at the clinic are those necessary or recommended for school attendance.

There are several immunizations available.

For 7<sup>th</sup> grade: Tdap, MenACYW For 12<sup>th</sup> grade: MenACWY and MenB

For Kindergarten: Dtap & Polio combination and MMR & Chickenpox combination

**The deadline to register is Friday, April 30, 2021.**

*\*Parent/Guardian MUST be present with their child at the mobile immunization clinic at Lancaster High School unless they are 18 years old or older.*

**To register your child for the mobile immunization clinic, you will need to complete the following paperwork listed below and return all required forms to your child's school by Friday, April 30, 2021:**

**Student's Vaccination Record**

**A most recent copy of the Student's Insurance Card/Cards (front and back)**

**Completed and Signed Registration/Consent Form**
