CURRICULUM

GENERAL INFORMATION

<u>COURSE</u>	<u>CREDIT</u>	<u>CLASS TIME</u>
<u>ENGLISH 9-12</u> This course reviews grammar, usage, and writing skills. *Online course program	1	Session 1, 2 & 3
<u>GOVERNMENT</u> This course will study the Declaration of Independence, The U.S. Constitution and the Ohio Constitution, along with the rights and responsibilities of citizens. This course will also contain standards that pertain to government. *Online course program	1	Session 1, 2 & 3
<u>U.S. HISTORY</u> This course examines the people, places, and events shaping the development of present day American culture. This course will also cover the U.S. History standards. *Online course program	1	Session 1, 2 & 3
<u>WORLD HISTORY</u> This course will focus on foreign studies of various countries and customs and their relationships with the United States and democracy. This course will also focus on 9 th grade Social Studies standards. *Online course program	1	Session 1, 2 & 3
<u>MATH Algebra/Geometry/Alg 2/Math Apps</u> This course will focus on studying number and word problems. Topics include statistics, geometry, equations and ratios. This course will also cover some 9 th and 10 th grade Math standards *Online course program	1	Session 1, 2 & 3
<u>SCIENCE Physical Science/Biology/Environmental</u> This course will include the basic concepts of physical science and scientific method to understand and solve problems. *Online course program	1	Session 1, 2 & 3
<u>HEALTH</u> This course involves the teaching of the Health continuum. Some areas of study include mental health, stress management, nutrition, personal appearance, drug abuse, first aid and safety. Course may be completed for 1 st time credit. *Online course program *Also available June 28 – July 9, double lab sessions	½	Session 1, 2 & 3
<u>PHYSICAL EDUCATION</u> This course offers a combination of beginning lifetime sports as well as knowledge about oneself and lifetime activities. Written work and tests are part of the physical education curriculum. Lunch break provided, with lunch responsibility of student. Course may be completed for 1 st time credit.	¼	7:45 a.m.-2:00p.m.

CONFIRMATION OF ENROLLMENT

Students will be notified if a course is canceled. Class lists will be posted at Lancaster High School on June 13. All classes begin June 13, 2022. A minimum enrollment of 15 students is needed for any summer school course to be offered.

ROOM ASSIGNMENT

Students enrolled in summer school will take courses through our online curriculum-*OdysseyWare*. Courses will be completed in the Computer Lab with the exception of PE

ATTENDANCE

Because of the limited time involved, **students must attend their assigned lab session daily.** *Only two absences* are permitted in any class and a physician's note to the coordinator upon returning to class is required. The only exception that will be made are those related to quarantine, COVID -19 and documented COVID - 19 symptoms. Unexcused absences and/or tardiness will result in a student being dropped from the course. Two tardies equal one absence. Students are required to spend additional time beyond their scheduled lab session to complete assignments. All coursework and exams must be completed by July 9 for credit to be earned. We will have certified teachers available during lab sessions for students who are in need of assistance.

FEES

For 2022, Summer School will be **FREE OF CHARGE for all LHS Students.** Non-LHS Students - Students will be charged a fee of \$50 for one-fourth and one-half credit courses and \$65 for a full-credit course. Normal fee waivers (free lunch recipients) will apply to Summer School fees. For each course All students are required to pay an additional application processing expense of \$25 for one-fourth or one-half credit course and \$35 for a full credit course. This expense is due when the student registers for class.

REFUND POLICY

Students may not withdraw from a course after the first day of class nor receive any refund of monies paid. Students withdrawing at any time before the first day of summer school will receive a refund of all fees, provided a paid fee receipt accompanies the request. The only exception to this regulation will be personal illness as certified by a physician or in dire emergency situations.

GRADES

The final grade will be sent to the principal's office where the student will be enrolled for the 2022-23 school year, and will be mailed to the student at the completion of summer school, after all fees are paid, at the address listed on the registration form.

MAXIMUM CREDIT

A student may take a maximum of two (2) full credits of work. You may only receive credit once in your high school career for the same subject in summer school.

STUDENT BEHAVIOR

Students are expected to adhere to all rules regarding behavior as outlined in the Lancaster High School handbook. Any violations may result in removal from the summer school program; no refunds will be provided.

ELIGIBILITY

Summer school is available to all students who reside within the Lancaster City School District. Out-of-district students will be accepted if space is available.
